#### Cité des Télécoms overview



There are 2 buildings at the Cité des Télécoms.

- A two-storey exhibition centre.
- It is dedicated to the history and evolution of telecommunications and digital technology.
- The Radôme is a large white dome.
- It houses a telecommunication antenna.
   This antenna received the first live television
   broadcast from the United States via satellite.





# **Getting information**



• The information desk is accessible to a person in a wheelchair.



The information desk has a hearing loop installed.
 A hearing loop is an assistive listening device for people with hearing aids.





# Visiting the Cité des télécoms

#### For individual visitors

- The exhibition is accessible without a guided tour.
- You go to the Radôme during an immersive tour.

During the immersive tour, you travel back in time thanks to the setting and devices.





- Visitors can enjoy activities and exhibition tours led by an educator.
- An educator is a tour-guide.
- Information about the schedule of these activities can be found at the information desk.



#### For groups

- Tours are adjusted to meet the needs of various groups.
  - Pre-visit preparation is available with the person in charge of the group.
- Groups are received upon arrival and accompanied by one or more educators during the entire visit.



# Using tools of visit —Upon request at the information desk

If you have visual impairments (e.g., blindness), ask the staff at the information desk for the lending of

- An audioguide.
- A booklet in large-print about the Radôme.
- A magnifying glass and lighted magnifying light.



If you have hearing impairments (e.g. deafness), ask the staff at the information desk for the lending of

- An audioguide including subtitled contents.
- A booklet about the Radôme.
- A headphone with a hearing loop installed.
   A hearing loop is an assistive listening device for people with hearing aids.



If you have neurodivergent conditions, ask the staff at the information desk for the lending of

A noise-cancelling headphone.



## Finding your way

You can dowload the site map at the information desk by scanning a QR code with your smartphone.

- Each exhibition room has a number and a name.
- A tactile replica is located on the ground floor the exhibition centre.







## **Getting around**

- Service dogs, including guide dogs, are welcome.
- Cane chairs are available at the entrance of the first exhibition room.
- Wheelchairs are availabe upon request at the information desk, based on availability.
- The lift is located after the second exhibition room. The lift takes you upstairs. To go to the Radôme, you must go upstairs and exit the exhibition centre.
- The Radôme is accessible to a person in a wheelchair using a specific entrance.
- Most exhibition rooms are accessible to a person in a wheelchair.

Exhibition room 5 and an activity room are not accessible to a person in a wheelchair.





# Sitting down and relaxing

There is a relaxing area upstairs.
 Chairs and tables are available next to the vending machines.

There is vending machine for drinks, sweets and snacks.

- There are benches in different rooms of the exhibition centre.
- There are several picnic areas in the park.
- Accessible toilets are located on the ground floor.
- A changing table is upstairs, next to the toilets and the vending machines.

- By train Lannion train station + taxi or bus. <u>Le réseau urbain et péri-urbain TILT (lannion-tregor.com)</u>
- By car:
  - a 10-minute drive from Lannion to Perros-Guirec.
  - -From National Road 12 « Brest-Rennes », take the exit
  - « Lannion ».

Follow the signs « Pleumeur-Bodou » and « parc du Radôme ».

By bus: line D - « Parc du Radôme » stop in summer only.
 About 500 m to walk with a steep drop from the bus stop.

#### Parking lots for mobility-impaired persons

 A drop-off area is located in front of the entrance to the exhibition centre.

3 parking spaces in the visitors parking lots


